## **Checklist for Assessment Grants**

- **Federal materials in <u>grants.gov</u>**.
- Threshold Criteria
  - Applicant Eligibility: Eligible entities include local governments or quasi-governmental entity, regional councils, redevelopment agencies, state and tribes, non-profits, and qualified community development entities.
  - Community Involvement: A summary of how you intend to inform and involve the community and other stakeholders in the planning, implementation, and other brownfield assessment activities described in your application.
  - Named Contractors and Subrecipients: EPA does not require or encourage applicants to name procurement contractors (including consultants) or subrecipients in applications for Brownfields grant funding. However, if an applicant chooses to identify a procurement contractor(s) or subrecipient(s) to conduct work proposed in this application, the applicant must comply with the requirements outlined in FY22 guidelines even if the entity is referred to as a "partner" in the application.
  - □ **Expenditure of current EPA Brownfields Assessment funds:** The applicant must demonstrate that payment has been received from EPA for at least 70% of each Assessment cooperative agreement they have with EPA by October 1, 2021.
  - Brownfields definition (for Site-Specific Assessment Grants only): Site fits under the definition of a brownfield site under CERCLA§10(39) as described in the Information on Sites
    Eligible for Brownfields under CERCLA§104(k).
  - □ **<u>Eligibility criteria for CERCLA Liability (for Site-Specific Assessment Grants only)</u>: Entities liable for contamination on the site are not eligible for Brownfields Grant funding.**
  - Enforcement or other actions (for Site-Specific Assessment Grants only): Identify known ongoing or anticipated environmental enforcement or other actions related to the site for which Brownfields Grant funding is sought.
  - □ Sites Requiring a Property-Specific Determination (for Site-Specific Assessment Grants only): Please refer to Section 1.5 in the Information on Sites Eligible for Brownfields under CERCLA § 104(k).
  - □ Waiver of the \$200,000 Limit (for Site-Specific Assessment Grants only): Entities that are applying for a Site-specific Assessment Grant may request a waiver of the \$200,000 limit and request up to \$350,000 for a single site based on the anticipated level of contamination, size, or status of ownership of the site.
- State letter: Letter of Support from State or Tribal Environmental Authority.
- □ **<u>Narrative</u>**: The proposal with responses to the ranking criteria (10-page limit, single-spaced)
- □ Narrative Information Sheet: Summary of grant information (2-page limit, single-spaced)
