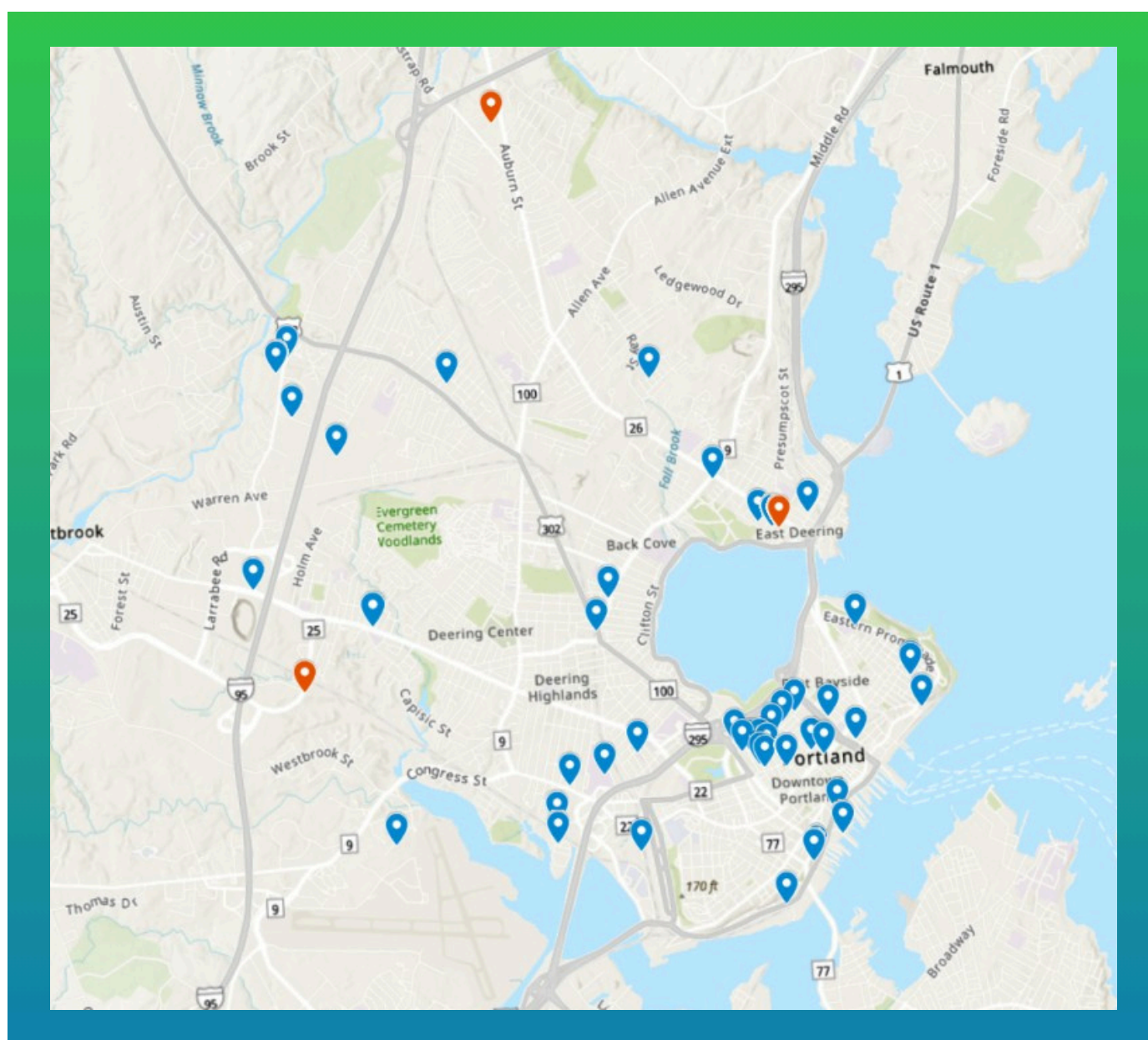

Community Description

The City of Portland is the largest city in Maine, with a population of about 68,000 people. With a significant area along the Maine coastline, the city has a notable history of industries related to maritime trade such as ship repair, paper and wood manufacturing, and commercial fishing. To this day, commercial fishing is an important part of the local economy, supplemented by a large tourism industry. This industrial legacy has also resulted in higher-than-average levels of environmental contamination and associated public health concerns for residents such as proximity to lead paint, hazardous waste proximity, and the prevalence of toxic releases to the air, as compared to the state and nation.



Grant History

Since 2016, the City of Portland has received \$1.75 million in EPA Brownfield Grant funding for the assessment and cleanup of sites citywide.

Brownfield Inventory

- 40 sites identified as brownfields
- 3 priority sites identified by UConn TAB based on criteria such as city ownership, site assessment status, and public health indicators for the surrounding area
