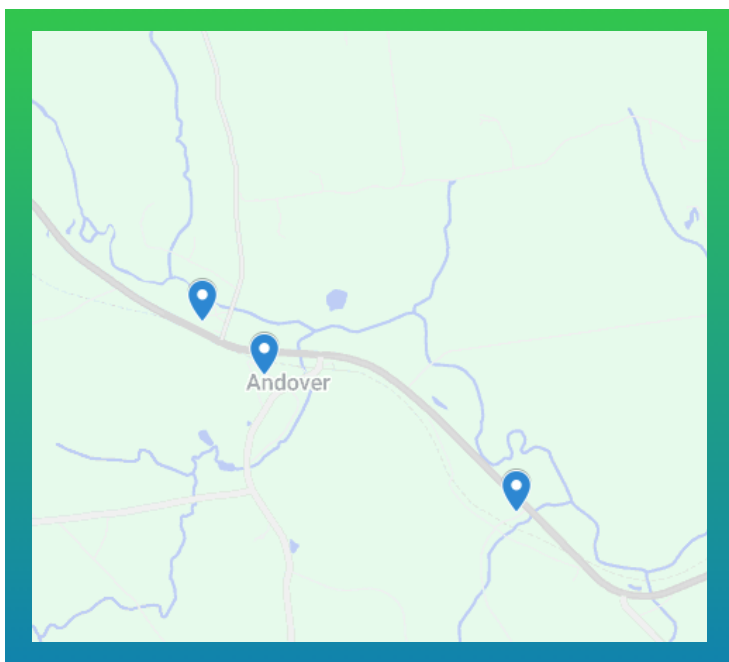

Community Description

Andover is a small rural community in eastern Connecticut, bordered by the towns of Coventry, Bolton, Columbia, and Hebron. The 3151-resident town is characterized by a large proportion of middle-aged to elderly residents (median age of 50). The legacy of Andover's industrial past is visible through former mill buildings scattered throughout the community. In particular, the town has a significant paper manufacturing history that lasted from the 19th century to the great depression, at which point many of the larger paper mills ceased operations. Today, the town is considered a commuter town, mostly comprised of residential development and conservation/green space.
