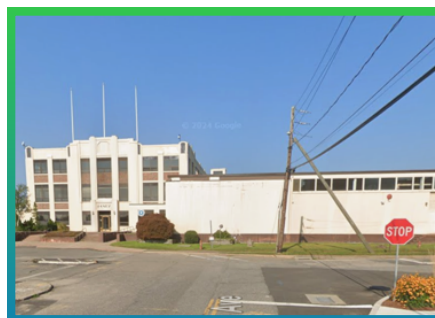
Community Description

Clinton is a historical coastal community of 13,317 (2023 estimate). The town is located in southern Connecticut situated along the the Long Island Sound, and is a part of the Lower Connecticut River Valley. The town encompasses 19mi² in Middlesex County, 15% of which is water, and officially became a part of CT in 1838. Clinton's industrial history dates back to the mid-to-late 1800s, when both the Shore Line East rail line and shipyards opened the door for manufacturers to settle in Clinton and distribute their products. Since then, the community has remained in touch with its maritime roots and holds regional significance as both a shoreline community and a hub of local commerce and heritage.
