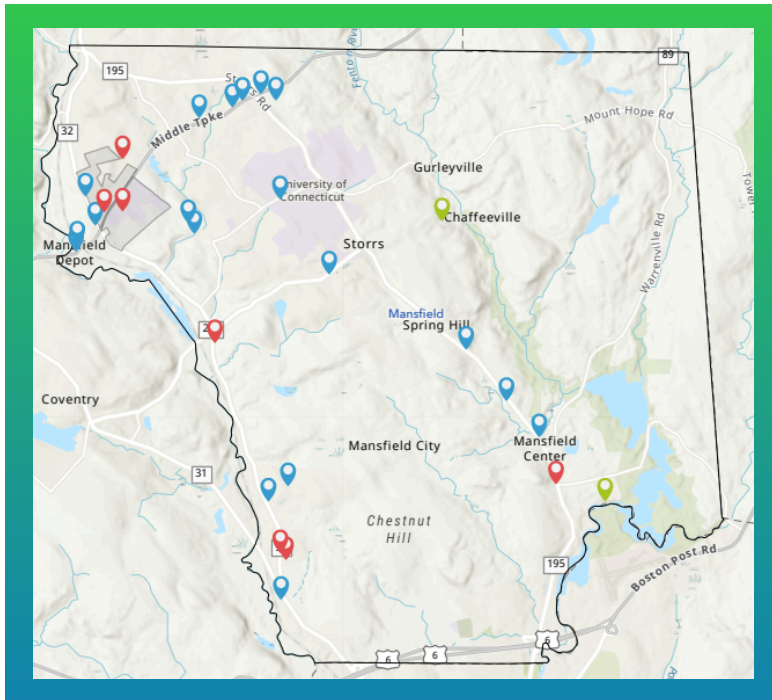

Community Description

Located in the northeast corner of Tolland County, Connecticut, Mansfield is 45.5 square miles with a total population close to 26,000 (U.S. Census Bureau, 2020). The town is made up of 19 distinct historic villages including Storrs, Mansfield Depot, and Mansfield Center. Mansfield's earliest industrial history dates to the early 1800s where the town produced such goods as gunpowder, organ pipes, bronze cannons, and most notably- silk. By the 1800s, three quarters of homes in Mansfield were involved in silk production. The first silk mill in the US was constructed in 1810 by Rodney and Horatio Hanks, known as Hanks Silk Mill.
